MILITIA GENERAL ORDERS.

HEAD QUARTERS, FREDERICTON, 4th October, 1865.

No. 54.

HIS Excellency the Administrator of the Government in Council offers for Competition to each Battery and Company of Volunteer Militia, a Silver Medal, to be fired for under the following regulations:—

1. The ranges and rules to be the same as those established this year for the competition of His Royal Highness the Prince of Wales' Challenge Cup.

2. The best shot of a Battery or Company not to be entitled to the Medal unless he shall have made thirty eight points.

3. The Return of the competition to be forwarded to the Office of the Adjutant General, on or before the 30th November, 1865, after which date none can be received; a certificate is also in each case to be sent by the Officer Commanding, to the effect that the competition took place on one fixed day, and on that day only; that it was conducted according to the Hythe Regulations.

In order to ensure punctuality in forwarding these Returns, His Excellency the Commander in Chief wishes to call the attention of Officers Commanding Companies to the General Order No. 9, of 24th February, 1863.
