(Circular)

Downing Street, 28th February, 1865.

SIR,—I transmit to you a copy of a Letter from the Royal Horticultural Society, with a copy of a Statement shewing their intention to offer a Prize for the best Representative Collection of Fruit and Vegetables from any of the Colonies, to be exhibited at the Society's International Fruit Show in 1865.

You will perceive that the Exhibition is fixed for the month of December in the present year.

I should be glad if the Colonists of New Brunswick shall be able to avail themselves of the invitation of the Society, by which I understand them to desire the exhibition of such Fruit and Vegetables (being capable of transmission to this Country) as may either be characteristic of the Colony and not equally produceable in many other parts of the world, or which, from local advantages, may be produced
