A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS the General Assembly of this Province stands prorogued to Thursday, the seventeenth instant, I have thought fit further to prorogue the said General Assembly, and the same is hereby prorogued accordingly to Thursday, the nineteenth day of October next.

Given under my Hand and Seal at Fredericton, the tenth day of August in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty five, and in the twenty ninth year of Her Majesty's Reign.

IN COUNCIL—11th August, 1865.

ORDERED, That the Registration Fee imposed on Letters by Part VII, Sections 2 and 3, of the Post Office Regulations, approved by the Governor in Council, and issued in 1862, be reduced from ten cents to five cents in addition to postage, when prepaid, and from twenty cents to ten cents in addition to postage, on unpaid Letters.

MONEY LETTERS.

Registration.

The attention of the public is directed to the foregoing Order in Council, reducing the Post Office Fee on Registered Letters, passed with a view to encourage the Registration of Letters containing Money or Articles of Value, as the best means, (when the Money Order System is not resorted to,) of securing the safe transmission and delivery of such Letters.

Although Registration is not an absolute guarantee or protection against fraud, it affords the means of tracing the Letter through each Office to its actual delivery, and cannot be suppressed without leaving the Officer into whose hands it has been traced individually accountable for its disposal. The use of wax, in addition to adhesive envelopes upon such Letters, is suggested as an additional security against the abstraction of the contents.

Registration applies to all Letters indiscriminately, whether containing value or not.
