IN THE SUPREME COURT.

HILARY TERM, 28th Victoria, 1865.

GENERAL RULE.

ORDERED, That no service of any paper on an Attorney in any cause, shall be deemed good service by leaving such paper at his dwelling house or last place of abode, unless it shall appear by the affidavit of service that the Attorney has no Office, or if having an Office, that the same was closed, or if open, that there was no person in such Office upon whom service could be made; in any of which cases, leaving the same at the dwelling house or last place of residence of the Attorney, shall be deemed sufficient service thereof.
