A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by an Act made and passed in the thirteenth year of the Reign of Her present Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled "An Act relating to the Trade between the British North American Possessions," I have been authorized, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, whenever it may be thought advisable so to do, to declare by Proclamation what articles, the growth, produce or manufacture of either of the British North American Possessions of Canada, Nova Scotia, Prince Edward Island, and Newfoundland, may be imported into this Province free of Duty ;—

I have therefore thought fit, by and with the advice and consent aforesaid, to declare, and I do hereby declare, that the following articles, being of the growth, production or manufacture of the said British North American Possessions of Canada, Nova Scotia, Prince Edward Island, and Newfoundland, or of either of them, may be imported into this Province free of Duty, that is to say :—

Pork and Beef, salted and fresh ; Hams, smoked or dried ; Rock or Coal Oil, Benzole, and Parafine ; Horses, Mares, Geldings, and Oxen, Neat Cattle, Cows, and other Cattle ; Hogs alive, and Sheep.

Given under my Hand and Seal at Fredericton, the twenty first day of Juy, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty six, and in the thirtieth year of Her Majesty's Reign.
