PRIVATE AND LOCAL BILLS.

THE following Rules were adopted by both Houses of ▲ the Legislature at the Session of 1864:-

"That no Bill of a private or local nature, or Bill for making any amendments of a like nature to any former Act, shall be received by the House, unless a notice, specifying the several objects desired to be attained, has been published four successive weeks, previous to the meeting of the Legislature, or to the introduction of the Bill, in some one of the Newspapers published in the City or County interested in the measure, or in the locality where the parties affected
