A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS the General Assembly of this Province stands prorogued to Thursday the fifteenth day of February instant, I have thought fit further to prorogue the said General Assembly, and the same is hereby prorogued accordingly to Thursday the eighth day of March next, then to meet at Fredericton for the dispatch of business.

Given under my Hand and Seal at Fredericton, the fourteenth day of February, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty six, and in the twenty ninth year of Her Majesty's Reign.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by the First Article of a Treaty between Her Majesty and the United States of America, signed at Washington on the fifth day of June in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty four, it was among other things agreed that the inhabitants of the United States should "have in common with the subjects of Her Britannic Majesty, the liberty to take fish of every kind except shell fish, on the Sea Coasts and Shores, and in the Bays, Harbours and Creeks of Canada, New Brunswick, Nova Scotia, Prince Edward Island, and of the several Islands thereto adjacent, without being restricted to any distance from the shore."

And whereas the United States of America have, in accordance with the terms of the said Treaty, given notice of the termination thereof:

And whereas in consequence of such notice, the said Treaty will expire on the 17th March 1866:

And whereas many persons engaged therein may be unaware that their right to carry on such in-shore fisheries will accordingly altogether cease and determine on the said seventeenth day of March instant;

I have therefore deemed it expedient to issue this my Proclamation, and do hereby caution and warn all persons, not being subjects of Her Majesty, that after the said seventeenth day of March instant, any Vessels or Boats owned and manned in the United States of America, pursuing the in-shore fisheries, will be liable to confiscation, and the parties engaged in such fisheries will also be liable to such

other penalties, pecuniary and personal, as are by law provided.

Given under my Hand and Seal at Fredericton, the third day of March, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty six, and in the twenty ninth year of Her Majesty's Reign.
