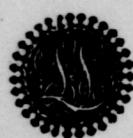

WHEREAS the General Assembly of this Province stands prorogued to Thursday the twenty eighth instant, I have thought fit further to prorogue the said General Assembly, and the same is hereby prorogued accordingly to Thursday the twenty fifth day of April next.

Given under my Hand and Seal at Fredericton, the twenty sixth day of March, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty seven, and in the thirtieth year of Her Majesty's Reign.

The QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty,

Lord President, Lord Chamberlain, Earl of Devon.

WHEREAS the Lieutenant Governor of Her Majesty's Province of New Brunswick, with the Council and Assembly of the said Province, did, in the month of July 1866, pass an Act which has been transmitted, entitled as follows, viz:—

No. 3140. An Act to authorize the connexion of Railway Lines, and to provide for the management and regulation of connecting Lines of Railroads in this Province.

And whereas the said Act has been laid before Her Majesty in Council, together with a letter to the Lord President of the Council from the Right Honorable the Earl of Carnarvon, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, recommending that the said Act should be left to its operation; Her Majesty was thereupon this day pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve the said recommendation: Whereof the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, or Commander in Chief for the time being, of Her Majesty's Province of New Brunswick, and all other persons whom it may concern, are to take notice and govern themselves accordingly.
