* The Conditions as to the description of boats to compete in Classes C and D will be announced in April.

Entries must be made between the 15th of May and Saturday the 15th of June 1867, inclusive, by letter addressed to the Secretary of the Committee, Charles Wylde, Esq., Paris Exhibition, South Kensington Museum, London, to whom all communications should be addressed. The letter should state the name and address of the Club or person desiring to enter a boat, the class in which it is to compete, and the number of oars. If the boat is to be entered in Class A the letter should contain a Post Office order for the entrance fee.

It has been decided by the Committee that it will be lawful for any boat to compete with or without a coxswain.

Each boat must have a flag staff in the bows at least one foot high over the gunwale, and if it is desired to carry a particular distinctive flag, the colour of the flag should be stated, and the Committee will endeavour to arrange in accordance with this desire when the entry is made early.

The Committee have selected a course at St. Cloud about a mile and a quarter in length, down stream, and will issue further regulations.

The Committee undertake to convey from a depot in or near London (to be hereafter named) to Paris and back again to London, any boat duly entered for a race, and to provide a suitable place for its custody and protection during the Regatta, but they will not be responsible for damage.

Dressing-rooms will be provided for the crews.

On the 7th and 8th July there will also be races for Rowing Boats on the Seine under French rules and management.

An Ocean Race for Yachts will start from England on the 4th July.

A Prize Flag for a Race between Steam Launches will be competed for at St. Cloud.
