## A PROCLAMATION.

BY virtue of the power and authority in me vested, I hereby, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, declare and proclaim to all whom it doth or may concern, that all that part of the Parish of Dorchester, in the County of Westmorland, and bounded as follows, viz:— From Fort Folly Point to the Memramcook Bridge, thence along the Post Road westerly to the Parish Line, thence along said Parish Line to the Petitcodiac River, thence down the River to the place of beginning, in the said County, shall be a Port of Entry, under the name of the Port of Rockland; and the same is hereby constituted and appointed a Port of Entry, and to have the same rights and privileges, and to be subject to the same rules and regulations as other Ports in this Province.

Given under my Hand and Seal at Fredericton, the twelfth day of April, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty seven, and in the thirtieth year of Her Majesty's Reign.
