GULF OF ST. LAWRENCE.

FIXED LIGHT IN GASPE BAY.

The Trinity House at Quebec has given Notice, that during the season the navigation is open, a Light will be exhibited on the Peninsula on Gaspé Bay, 12 miles N.W. by N. from Cape Gaspé.

The light is a *fixed* white light, elevated 40 feet above the level of the sea, with the following bearings from it:—

Cape Haldimand, South; Gaspé Basin, W. $\frac{1}{2}$ S.

The Light is intended to serve as a guide to vessels passing between Sandy Beach and the main land opposite.

[All bearings are magnetic. Variation $26^{\circ} 20'$ westerly in 1867.]

NEW BRUNSWICK PROVINCIAL RIFLE ASSOCIATION.

FREDERICTON, 15th May, 1867.

HIS Excellency the Commander in Chief has been pleased to direct that the following Bye Laws of the New Brunswick Provincial Rifle Association, adopted at the meeting of the Council, held at Saint John on the 1st instant, be published for general information.

BYE LAWS.

ARTICLE 1.—ELECTION OF OFFICERS.

The election of the Council of the Association, and of all Officers chosen or appointed by the Council, shall be by ballot, upon nomination duly made and seconded; and no vote shall count for any person not so nominated.

ARTICLE 2.—ANNUAL MEETING.

At least fourteen days' notice of the place appointed by the Council, for the annual meeting of the Association, shall be given by the Secretary by advertisement in the *Royal Gazette*.

ARTICLE 3.—MEETINGS OF COUNCIL.

1. The regular quarterly meetings of the Council shall be held on the first Thursday in May, August, November, and February, at such time and place as the President may direct.

2. Special meetings of the Council may be called at any time by the President, and shall be called by him on the written request of any two members of the Council.

3. Notice of the time and place of every quarterly and special meeting of the Council, shall be issued by the Secretary to each member, at least ten days before the day appointed for the meeting.

4. Meetings of the Council may be adjourned from day to day, as may be found necessary.

5. If at any quarterly or special meeting of the Council, a quorum be not present, three members of the Council, (an Officer of the Association being one), shall have power, after waiting half an hour, to adjourn the meeting to another time; and it shall not be necessary to issue notices for such adjourned meeting.

ARTICLE 4.—COMPETITIONS.

1. The annual meeting, to compete for the Prizes offered by the Association, shall be held at such time and place, during the first week in September in each year, as the Council may appoint.

2. Notice of the time and place of the Annual Competition shall be given by the Secretary, by advertisement in the *Royal Gazette*, at least one month before the first of the days appointed for the meeting.
