(No. 399.) CROWN LAND DEPARTMENT, 3rd July, 1867.

1st. IT is Ordered by His Excellency in Council, That after this date all Correspondence by Mail or Telegraph with the Crown Land Department must be prepaid, and no Letters, &c. not so prepaid, will be received after the first day of August next.

Petitions for Land already surveyed will be transmitted free of postage, either through Local Deputies or Labour Act Commissioners.

In cases of Petitions for unsurveyed Lots, a sum of one dollar must be deposited with each Petition.

2nd.—An uniform rate of charge of \$3 per Lot will hereafter be made for cost of survey of all Lots surveyed at the expense of Government, one dollar of which will be credited to the Postage Fund, and two dollars to the Survey Fund.

3rd.—Local Deputies and Labour Act Commissioners corresponding with the Department, or transmitting Returns or Land Petitions, will prepay the postage, and render their Accounts Quarterly for payment.
