Description of Peter Hall and John Hall, escaped Prisoners.

PETER HALL is about 27 years of age, 5 feet 8 inches in height, brown hair and grey eyes, a pale, thin, long visage, and sneaky look.

JOHN HALL is 23 years of age, 5 feet 3 inches in height, eyes blue, hair dark brown, complexion fresh, scar on right side of upper lip, mole on left cheek near the eye, has a blemish on right eye, and is tattooed on both arms, is a Soldier of the 15th Regiment.

HOUSE OF ASSEMBLY.

THE following was adopted as one of the Standing Rules of the House in the Session of 1862:—

"26th.—That no Bill of a private nature shall be received

by the House after the fourteenth day from the opening of the Session, both inclusive; and that the Clerk of this House do, one month previous to the meeting of the Legislature, cause fifty copies of this Rule to be sent to each of the Clerks of the Peace in the several Counties, for distribution, and cause the same to be inserted in the Royal Gazette, and two Newspapers in such County where Newspapers are published."

CROWN LAND OFFICE, 26th Feb. 1867.

IT is ordered in Council, That any person who has procured Land under the Labour Act, (or his assigns) before the 1st day of January 1861, but has not yet resided and improved as prescribed by the Regulations, may apply to have the Sale cancelled and the Lot advertised for sale by Public Auction, subject to the payment of the value of existing improvements; and if such person, or his assigns, be the purchaser, fifty per cent. of the labour returned will be credited on the purchase.

It is further ordered, that all Sales before 1st January, 1861, to persons under the Labour Act, and not yet granted, shall be cancelled on the 1st day of November, 1868, and the Lots then become vacant, unless such persons do previously perform the necessary conditions of payment, improvement, and residence, or avail themselves of the privilege above offered.

The equitable interest of the parties (or their assigns) who may have made improvements or performed labour on any of the Lots to be sold or forfeited, will in all cases be fully protected against subsequent purchasers; but in no case shall such persons having made improvements on the Lands, or performed labour in part or in whole for such Lands, have any claim therefor upon the Government of this Province.
