A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by an Inquisition taken by the Coroner of Saint John on the twenty sixth day of December instant, at the Court House in the City of Saint John, on the body of a new born male child, a verdict has been rendered by the Jury of Wilful Murder against some person or persons unknown;

I do therefore publish this my Proclamation, and offer a Reward of One Hundred Dollars to any person or persons who shall give such information as will lead to the apprehension and conviction of the person or persons guilty of the alleged murder.

Rector of Lubec, in the said United States, have this day filed in the Provincial Secretary Office of the Province of New Brunswick, a Memorandum of Association for the incorporation of a Company to be styled the "L'Etang Island Mining and Manufacturing Company," for the purpose of developing the Mineral resources of the Island by Mining, with such other things as are incident to the attainment of that object, and the manufacturing of the same, with a Capital of one hundred and fifty thousand dollars, (\$150,000) to be divided into fifteen thousand shares of ten dollars each, and that the Office and principal place of business will be in Saint John, in the County of Saint John.—Dated at Fredericton the thirty first day of December, A. NEW BRUNSWICK PROVINCIAL RIFLE ASSOCIATION.

HIS Excellency the Commander in Chief has been pleased to direct that the following Rules, adopted at a meeting held at Saint John, on the 19th instant, for the constitution of the above named Association, be published for general information. His Excellency directs special attention to Rules 2, 3 and 4, and requests that subscriptions be forwarded to the Treasurer of the Association on or before the 22nd instant, when an adjourned meeting will be held at Saint John for the election of a Council and transaction of other business.

RULES, &c.

NAME.

1. This Association shall be called "THE NEW BRUNSWICK PROVINCIAL RIFLE ASSOCIATION."

MEMBERS.

2. Any person being a British subject, subscribing Two Dollars to the funds of the Association, shall be a member thereof for the year in which such subscription shall be made.

3. A contribution of Twenty Dollars to the Association shall constitute the donor a Life Member thereof.

4. Any Non-commissioned Officer or Private of any Battalion, Volunteer Troop, Battery, or Company, subscribing not less than Half a Dollar to the funds of the Association, shall be a member thereof for the year in which such subscription shall be made, and entitled to the privilege of competing for the Prizes under its control, in like manner with any other member; but no member subscribing less than two dollars to the funds of the Association shall be entitled to vote at its meetings.

5. All subscriptions from the Non-commissioned Officers and Men of the Battalions, Volunteer Troops, Batteries, or Companies, shall be paid to the Treasurer through the Commanding Officers of such Battalions, Troops, Batteries, or Companies, respectively.

6. On payment of any subscription or contribution, corresponding tickets of membership shall be issued by the Secretary, which shall contain the name of the member, and shall not be transferable; and any member subscribing Two Dollars or any larger sum to the funds of the Association, shall, by virtue of his member's ticket, be entitled to attend all lectures, concerts, or other public meetings of, or for the benefit of the Association.

7. No Officer, Non-commissioned Officer, or Man of the Militia of New Brunswick, not being a member of the Association, shall be allowed to compete for any prizes under its control.

ANNUAL MEETING.

8. The Annual Meeting of the Members of the Association for the election of a Council, and the transaction of other business, shall be held on the first Wednesday in October in each year, at such hour and place as the Council shall appoint.

OFFICE BEARERS.

9. A Patron and Vice-Patrons of the Association may be named by the Council.

10. The Council shall, at its first meeting after each Annual General Meeting of the Association, choose from among its members a President, who shall be President of the Association.
