2

12. The Council shall annually appoint a Treasurer and also a Secretary of the Association.

13. The Council shall consist of the Vice-Presidents, Treasurer and Secretary of the Association *ex officio*; and also of not more than twenty members, fifteen of whom shall be elected annually by a majority of votes taken by ballot at the general meeting, and five subsequently chosen by the Council so constituted.— Five members of the Council shall form a quorum for the transaction of business.

14. The Council shall conduct and control the business of the Association, and shall meet quarterly, or oftener if required by the President, or any two of its members. 15. The Council shall have power to fill any vacancy which may exist in the number of its members, or of the office bearers

of the Association, and to enact Bye-Laws for the regulation of the competitions for the Prizes of the Association, and of all other matters committed to its charge, subject to the approval of the Commander in Chief on all subjects of a purely military character.

16. The Treasurer shall keep the Accounts of the Association, which shall be audited annually and reported upon to the general meeting by two members appointed by the Council for that purpose.

17. The Secretary shall conduct all correspondence and keep minutes of the proceedings of all meetings of the Association and of the Council.

#### COMPETITORS.

18. All competitors for Prizes shall be required to appear in the uniform of their respective corps, and shall be certified by their commanding officers to be efficient in such manual and platoon and other military exercises as may be ordered by the Commander in Chief.

### ALTERATIONS IN RULES.

19. No alteration in these Rules shall be made except at the annual meeting of the Association by a vote of a majority of the members present and entitled to vote at such meeting.
