## GOVERNMENT NOTICE.

Under Act 25th Victoria, Chapter 28.

THESE are to certify, that John W. Wright, James A. Kinnear, John R. The Synod of the Presbyterian Church of New Brunswick, in connexion with the Church of Scotland, at their late Meeting, in Saint John, agreed upon the Address to His Excellency General Doyle, which is here subjoined.

On Tuesday the third instant, the Reverend Doctor Brooke of this City, the Reverend Doctor Donald of Saint John, Doctor Jack, President of the University, and T. R. Robertson, Esquire, Deputy Treasurer, as a Deputation from the Synod, waited upon His Excellency at Government House, by appointment, and presented the Address.

May it please Your Excellency,—

WE, the Ministers and Elders of the Presbyterian Church of New Brunswick, in connexion with the Church of Scotland, avail ourselves of this, the first opportunity that has occurred since your arrival in the Province, to offer you our sincere congratulations on being called to represent our beloved Sovereign as Lieutenant Governor of that portion of the British Dominions where our lot is cast.

As a Branch of a Church established by law in the Mother Country, we beg to assure Your Excellency that we cease not to inculcate upon the people under our charge, a spirit of loyalty to the British Throne, and a love for those civil and religious Institutions, under which we, in common with our fellow subjects, are privileged to live.

We congratulate Your Excellency on the success that has hitherto attended your government, and on the prosperity which the Province has enjoyed under your rule.

Though it is our peculiar duty to preach the Gospel of peace, yet we are not ungrateful to the gallant defenders of our Country, and we feel that we are under the highest obligations to Your Excellency, who, in conjunction with your esteemed friend, Admiral Sir James Hope, when a band of lawless men threatened to make an incursion into our territories, came so promptly to the rescue, and drove them back from our shores.

It is our earnest prayer that Your Excellency may continue to enjoy health, and may be aided by grace from on high, in the faithful discharge of your important duties, and that, wherever, in after life, your lot may be ordered by Divine Providence, every temporal and spiritual blessing may be yours.
