A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS Her Majesty the Queen, by virtue of the power and authority in Her vested by the Act of the Imperial Parliament for the Union of Canada, Nova Scotia, and New Brunswick, has been graciously pleased to issue Her Royal Proclamation, fixing the first day of July next for such Union: I do hereby appoint the said first day of July a Public Holiday in this Province, and invite all Her Majesty's loving subjects to celebrate the said day accordingly.

Given under my Hand and Seal at Fredericton, the twenty second day of June, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty seven, and in the thirty first year of Her Majesty's Reign.
