A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS His Excellency the Governor General has issued a Proclamation for the keeping of *Wednesday* next, the first of July, as a day for the celebration of the Anniversary of the establishment of the Dominion of Canada ;—

I do hereby appoint WEDNESDAY, the said first day of July, a Public Holiday in this Province, and invite all Her Majesty's loving Subjects to celebrate the said day accordingly.

> Given under n.y Hand and Seal at Fredericton, the twenty fifth day of June, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty eight, and in the thirty second year of Her Majesty's Reign.
