WHEREAS the General Assembly of this Province stands prorogued to Thursday the eighteenth instant, I have thought fit further to prorogue the said General Assembly, and the same is hereby prorogued accordingly to Thursday the thirtieth day of July next.

Given under my Hand and Seal at Fredericton, the seventeenth day of June, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty eight, and in the thirty first year of Her Majesty's Reign.

SIR,—I am directed by His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor to transmit to you, for the information of the Government of the Province of New Brunswick, a copy of a Certified copy of an Order of His Excellency the Governor General in Council, respecting certain Acts passed by the Legislature of this Province in the first Session thereof since the passing of the "British North America Act," which have been left to their operation.

Copy of a Report of a Committee of the Honorable the Privy Council, approved by His Excellency the Governor General in Council, on the 4th July, 1868.

On a Memorandum dated June 26th, 1868, from the Honorable the Minister of Justice and Attorney General, reporting with reference to the Imperial "British North America Act, 1867," and also to the Order in Council of the 9th June ultimo, on his Memorandum relative to the course to be pursued with respect to the Acts passed by the Provincial Legislature, that he considers the Acts mentioned in the annexed Schedule, passed by the Legislature of the Province of New Brunswick, in the first Session thereof, to be free from objection of any kind.

The Committee advise that the Acts enumerated in the annexed Schedule be left to their operation accordingly.
