**I**T is Ordered by His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor, in Council, that in all cases of contested claims to improvements upon Crown Lands, the Surveyor General (when informed of such contested claims, and on receipt of an application for sale or approval under the Labour Act, of any such Lands) shall issue an Order to the Local, or any other Deputy, residing near to the Lot in dispute, directing him, after giving all parties notice, carefully to examine the several claims, and ascertain the facts by the best available proofs, and report the result to the Surveyor General; the expenses of such examination and report to be paid in equal proportions by the several claimants,
