LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL CHAMBER,

FREDERICTON, 23RD MARCH, 1868.

At three o'clock this day, His Excellency Colonel Francis Pym Harding, C. B., Lieutenant Governor, came to the Council Chamber, and being seated on the Throne, commanded the attendance of the House of Assembly; who being come, His Excellency was pleased to close the Session with the following

SPEECH:
