EDUCATION OFFICE,

FREDERICTON, 4th February, 1868.

The following Regulations, adopted by the Board of Education, are published for general information:—

1. No Licensed Teachers engaged directly or indirectly in the sale of Spirituous Liquors, shall be allowed to retain their School Licenses; and no School License shall be issued to any person so engaged.

2. The Inspectors of Schools are authorized to visit and examine the County Grammar Schools within their respective Districts, and to report to the Chief Superintendent for the information of the Board.

3. Regulations to give effect to Act 30th Victoria, Chapter 27, relating to Grammar, Superior, and Common Schools, viz:—

1. All Assistant Teachers, to be entitled to Provincial aid, must be Licensed Teachers.

2. In any School, employing one Assistant Teacher, the average daily attendance must be not less than 40 pupils of six years of age or upwards; in a School with two Assistants, not less than 72, and in a School with three Assistants, not less than 100 pupils, to entitle such Assistant Teachers to Provincial aid.

CROWN LAND DEPARTMENT,

Fredericton, 10th Jan. 1868.

IT is Ordered by His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor, in Council, that in all cases of contested claims to improvements upon Crown Lands, the Surveyor General (when informed of such contested claims, and on receipt of an application for sale or approval under the Labour Act, of any such Lands) shall issue an Order to the Local, or any other Deputy, residing near to the Lot in dispute, directing him, after giving all parties notice, carefully to examine the several claims, and ascertain the facts by the best available proofs, and report the result to the Surveyor General; the expenses of such examination and report to be paid in equal proportions by the several claimants, and in the meantime to be charged as an incumbrance on the Lot. And if the dispute be not arranged, and the said expenses paid within three months after notice shall have been mailed to all the conflicting parties, the Lot may be advertised for sale by Public Auction, subject to payment of the estimated value of the improvements, out of which the expenses of investigation, &c., shall be paid, and the balance distributed *pro rata* amongst the several claimants, agreeably to the Deputy's Report. If there be only one claimant for the improvements, and he be not the purchaser of the Lot, all the expenses shall be paid out of its value. (10w)
