- 1st.—Every Mining Lease to be exempted from payment of Royalty for five years from its date. 2nd.—That the right of Mining within a Tract of one Square Mile, for the term of twenty five years, be put up at a fixed rent of one shilling per Chaldron on Coal, and five per cent. on the value of all other Minerals raised, to be paid on the first days of January, April, July, and October, in each year after the fifth, to the Receiver General or an Agent to be appointed by the Governor. 3rd.—That the upset preference price for each Lot to be five pounds. 4th.—That the preference money be paid, and the ground selected within one hour after the time of sale, after which other Lots will be offered if required, in like manner. 5th.—That the Lease contain a clause of renewal, or that the Government may resume and take the improvements at a valuation to be made by Arbitrators mutually chosen by the Surveyor General for the time being, and by the Lessee or his Assigns. 6th.—That if the Lessee shall not annually raise Coal or other Mineral to the value of four hundred dollars per mile from his ground within any one year after five years from date of said Lease, and so on annually during the continuance of the Lease, the same shall become forfeited.
