THE following is a List of the Laws passed at the recent Session of the Legislature :--

An Act to provide for defraying certain expenses of the Civil Government of the Province.

An Act to provide for the repair and improvement of Roads and Bridges, and other Public Works and Services.

An Act to authorize the Commissioners of Sewerage and Water Supply for the City of Saint John on the eastern side of the Harbour, and the Parish of Portland in the County of Saint John, to reimburse certain persons heretofore assessed for a Sewer on a part of King Street in the City of Saint John.

An Act to authorize the sale of Real Estate belonging to the estates of deceased persons, in certain cases.

An Act to authorize the Rector, Church Wardens and Vestry of Christ Church, in the Parish of Norton, to sell and dispose of certain Lands held by them in trust for School purposes.

An Act relating to Trustees.

An Act to authorize the extension of the Terms of the Court of General Sessions of the Peace in and for the City and County of Saint John, and for other purposes.

An Act to amend an Act intituled "An Act to incorporate the European and North American Railway Company for extension from Saint John westward."

An Act to authorize and empower the Justices of the Peace for the County of Northumberland to sell and convey a certain piece of School Land in the Parish of Chatham, and dispose of the proceeds thereof.

An Act in addition to an Act intituled "An Act further to increase the capital stock, and to continue and amend the Act to incorporate the Fredericton Boom Company."

An Act in addition to an Act intituled "An Act to establish and regulate a Ferry and Public Landing at Indian Town, in the County of Saint John."

An Act relating to Presentations to Rectories of the Church of England in the Province of New Brunswick.

An Act to establish an additional Polling place in the Parish of Saint Stephen, in the County of Charlotte.

An Act in addition to an Act to establish additional Polling places in the County of Carleton.

An Act to authorize the Justices of the Peace for the City and County of Saint John to raise a sum of money for enlarging and repairing the Common Gaol of the said City and County.

An Act for the maintenance of an Alms House and Work House in the Parish of Saint David, in the County of Charlotte.

An Act to amend the Law relating to the weight of Oats.

An Act to provide more effectually for the prevention of Bribery and Corruption at the Election of Members to serve in the General Assembly, and for the more effectual Trial of Election Petitions.

An Act in further addition to an Act intituled "An Act to empower the City Council of the City of Fredericton to contract a Loan in aid of the Fredericton Railway."

An Act to repeal Section 6, Chapter 106, Title xxvii, of the Revised Statutes, 'Of Marriage,' and to make other provisions in lieu thereof.

An Act in addition to Chapter 104, Title xxv, of the Revised Statutes, 'Of Regulations among Proprietors of Islands.'

An Act to repeal an Act made and passed in the 31st year of the Reign of Queen Victoria, intituled "An Act relating to the Central Bank of New Brunswick."

An Act to authorize the erection of a Public Wharf at the Town of Chatham, and to regulate the same.

An Act to repeal Chapter 36, Title iii, of the Revised Statutes, intituled

Of Desertion from Her Majesty's Forces.'

An Act to enable the General Sessions of the City and County of Saint John to provide for the payment of the amount remaining due and unpaid for and on account of the improvements made on the Public Landings at Indian Town, in the Parish of Portland.

An Act to repeal the ninth Section of an Act made and passed in the 31st year of the Reign of Queen Victoria, intituled "An Act to exempt the Homesteads of Families from levy or sale on Execution."

An Act to incorporate the Indian Town Steam Ferry Company.

An Act relating to the General Sessions of the Peace for the County of Carleton.

An Act to erect a part of the Parish of Simonds, in the County of Carleton, into a separate Town or Parish.
