A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS an Act intituled "An Act relating to the appointment of Justices of the Peace in the several Counties in this Province," passed by the Legislative Council and Assembly at the last Session of the Legislature, was reserved by me on the 21st day of April last for the signification of the Governor General's pleasure;

I do therefore hereby publish and declare that the said Act did receive the assent of the Governor General in Council on the 20th day of August last.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the 31st year of Her Majesty's Reign, intituled "An Act for the Union of Canada, Nova Scotia, and New Brunswick, and the government thereof, and for purposes connected therewith," it is

amongst other things enacted, that a Bill reserved for the signification of the pleasure of the Governor General, shall not have any force unless and until within one year from the day on which it was presented to the Lieutenant Governor for the Governor General's assent, the Lieutenant Governor signifies by Speech or Message to each of the Houses of the Legislature, or by Proclamation, that it has received the assent of the Governor General in Council; and whereas on the 21st day of April, 1869, the Lieutenant Governor of the Province of New Brunswick reserved a certain Bill, passed by the Legislative Council and Assembly of the said Province, intituled "A Bill relating to the appointment of Justices of the Peace in the several Counties in this Province," for the signification of the Governor General's pleasure thereon; and whereas the said Bill so reserved as aforesaid, has been laid before the Governor General in Council, and it is expedient that the said Bill should be assented to by the Governor General: Now, therefore, the Governor General, in pursuance of the said Act, and in the exercise of the powers thereby reserved to the Governor General as aforesaid, doth, by this present order, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, declare his assent to the said Bill; and the Secretary of State for the Provinces is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

ANNO TRICESIMO SECUNDO VICTORIÆ REGINÆ.

CAP. XCII.

An Act relating to the appointment of Justices of the Peace in the several Counties in this Province.

Section

1. Appointment of Magistrates, by whom made.
2. Commissions, how issued.
3. Magistrate to be sworn before Clerk of the Peace before entering upon duties of office; Clerk to keep a record.
4. Powers, &c. of Magistrate.
5. Former Commissions to remain in force.
6. Governor in Council may displace Magistrate.
7. Appointments made since 1st July 1867 to be valid.

21st April 1869.

BE it enacted by the Lieutenant Governor, Legislative Council, and Assembly, as follows:—

1. It shall be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, at any time or times, to appoint, under the Great Seal of this Province, such and so many Justices of the Peace in and for the several and respective Counties of this Province, and also for the City and County of Saint John, as may be deemed expedient and proper.

2. That in any Commission or Commissions to be issued, it shall be lawful to include the name of one or more person or persons, or to issue a separate Commission to each person to be appointed.

3. That each person to be appointed, shall, before entering on the duties of his office, be duly sworn before the Clerk of the Peace for the County, or City and County, for which he shall be appointed, and such Clerk shall keep a record or minute of such person being duly sworn, in which shall be stated the date of such person being duly sworn; an examined copy of such record or minute, or a copy cer-
