CAPE OF GOOD HOPE.

NOTICE TO MARINERS.

Change in Cape Recife Light to warn Ships of too near an approach to the Roman Rock in Algoa Bay.

ON and after the first December, 1868, a ray of Red Light will be shown from the Cape Recife Lighthouse, between a N. 39° E. bearing and the shore northwards from the Lighthouse.

Bearings are Magnetic.

DIRECTIONS.

Vessels bound for Algoa Bay, after passing Cape Recife, should not open the Red Light at the Cape until the Harbour Light upon the Hill is seen (which will first show red on a N. W. bearing, and lead nine tenths of a mile eastward of the Roman, where a course for the anchorage may be shaped with safety). As the Hill Light cannot be seen from the Roman Rock, a Ship is in safety so long as the Light can be seen; but as its southern extreme of visibility leads only two cables north of the Rock, it is recommended that a course for the anchorage should not be shaped until the region of the Red Light is passed, and the Hill Light shows White on a N. W. by W. bearing.

In beating in or out of the anchorage, the opening of the Red Light at either of the Lighthouses will be a signal for Vessels to tack when near the vicinity of the Roman Rock.
