

AUCTION.

TO be sold by Public Auction, on Monday the twenty second day of February next, at the hour of 11 o'clock, A. M., at Charles Campbell's, near Hammond River Bridge, in Hampton, King's County:—All those several lots, pieces, or parcels of Land hereinafter described, and situate, lying and being in the Parish aforesaid, and being sub-divisions of the Lands and Premises commonly known as the "Munger Property"; viz:—

LOT A.—All that certain lot, piece, or parcel of Land situate, lying and being in the Parish of Hampton, in King's County, and Province of New Brunswick, being part of Lot Number Eleven, (No. 11) heretofore deeded to William Munger, deceased, by James Munger and Margaret his wife, by Indenture dated the 31st December, A. D. 1787, to the Widow Sarah Hunt and others; the said part being bounded and described as follows—Commencing on the shore or bank of the east side of Hammond River, on the division line between Lot Number Eleven aforesaid and the adjoining Lot Number Ten; thence running south eighty four degrees fifteen minutes east (by the present magnet) along the said division line about one hundred and forty six chains sixty seven links, or until it strikes the rear or base line of the said Grant; thence along the said base line south five degrees forty five minutes west nine chains ninety nine links; thence north eighty four degrees fifteen minutes west parallel with the division line aforesaid, to a point seven chains fifty links distant from the bank of Hammond River aforesaid; thence south five degrees forty five minutes east seventy five links; thence north eighty four degrees fifteen minutes west, parallel with the division line aforesaid, seven chains fifty links, to the shore or bank of the River aforesaid; thence northerly down stream to the place of beginning, containing about one hundred and thirty acres more or less.

LOT B.—All that certain lot, piece, or parcel of Land situate, lying and being in the Parish of Hampton, in King's County, in the Province of New Brunswick, being parts of Lots Number Eleven and Number Twelve, heretofore deeded to William Munger, deceased, by James Munger and Margaret his wife, by Indenture dated the 31st December, A. D. 1796, which said Lots Numbers Eleven and Twelve were included in the Grant under the Great Seal of the Province aforesaid, bearing date the 15th February, A. D. 1787, to the Widow Sarah Hunt and others; the said parts of Lots Nos. 11 and 12 being bounded and described as follows—Commencing on the east bank or shore of Hammond River, at a point distant ten chains seventy four links southerly from the division line between said Lot Number Eleven and the adjoining Lot Number Ten, in the said Grant; thence running by the present magnet south eighty four degrees fifteen minutes east seven chains fifty links; thence north five degrees forty five minutes east seventy five links; thence south eighty four degrees fifteen minutes east, parallel to the said division line, about one hundred and thirty nine chains seventeen links, or to the rear or base line of the said Grant; thence along the said base line south five degrees forty five minutes west nine chains ninety nine links; thence north eighty four degrees fifteen minutes west, parallel to the aforesaid division line, until it strikes the bank or shore of the Hammond River aforesaid; thence northerly down stream to the place of beginning; containing about one hundred and thirty acres more or less.

LOT C.—All that certain lot, piece or parcel of Land situate, lying and being in the Parish of Hampton, in King's County, in the Province of New Brunswick, being part of Lot Number Twelve, heretofore deeded to William Munger, deceased, by James Munger and Margaret his wife, by Indenture dated the 31st December, A. D. 1796, which said Lot Number Twelve was included in the Grant under the Great Seal of the Province aforesaid, bearing date the 15th February, A. D. 1787, to the Widow Sarah Hunt and others; the said part being bounded and described as follows—Commencing on the east bank or

shore of Hammond River at a point distant nineteen chains ninety eight links southerly from the division line between Lots Numbers Ten and Eleven in the said Grant; thence parallel with the said division line south eighty four degrees fifteen minutes east (by the present magnet) about one hundred and forty six chains sixty seven links, or until it strikes the rear or base line of the said Grant; thence along the said base line south five degrees forty five minutes west nine chains ninety six links, or until it strikes the division line between said Lot Number Twelve and the adjoining Lot Number Thirteen; thence along the said last mentioned division line north eighty four degrees fifteen minutes west, until it strikes the bank or shore of the Hammond River aforesaid; thence northerly down stream to the place of beginning; containing one hundred and thirty acres more or less.

HOUSE OF ASSEMBLY.

THE following was adopted as one of the Standing Rules of the House in the Session of 1862:—

"26th.—That no Bill of a private nature shall be received by the House after the fourteenth day from the opening of the Session, both inclusive; and that the Clerk of this House do, one month previous to the opening of the Legislature, cause fifty copies of this Rule to be sent to each of the Clerks of the Peace in the several Counties, for distribution, and cause the same to be inserted in the Royal Gazette, and two Newspapers in such County where Newspapers are published."
