Information has been received that the shoal water round Escumenac Point, south point of Miramichi Bay, has extended to the northward, a depth of 2½ fathoms having been found N. E. 2½ miles from the Lighthouse.

NOVA SCOTIA—SEAL ISLAND.

Steam Fog Whistle.

The Government of the Dominion of Canada has given notice that a Steam Fog-Whistle has been erected in close proximity to the lighthouse on Seal Island, on the southwest coast of Nova Scotia, in lat. 45° 23' 34" N., long. 66° 0' 52" West of Greenwich.

During thick weather, fogs, and snow-storms, the whistle will be sounded in each minute as follows:—First a blast of *five seconds*, then an interval of *five seconds*, followed by a second blast of *five seconds*, after which an interval of *forty five seconds* to complete the minute before the whistle is again sounded.

The whistle may be expected to be heard from the following distances:—

In calm or moderate weather	..	15 miles.
In stormy weather,	..	5 to 8 miles.
Against the wind,	..	5 to 8 miles.
With the wind,	..	20 to 25 miles.
