A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS Her most Gracious Majesty, by Her Royal Warrant under Her Sign Manual dated the seventh day of May now last past, and transmitted by the Right Honorable the Secretary of State for the Colonies, did authorize and direct that a certain Seal prepared by the order of Her Majesty, and which accompanied the said Warrant, should be used for the sealing of all things whatsoever which pass the Great Seal of this Province, and for Her Majesty's Service in this Province;

I do therefore hereby proclaim and declare that the said Seal shall be henceforth used in this Province for the sealing of all things whatsoever, which shall pass the Great Seal of this Province, on, from and after the first day of January next.

Given under my Hand and Seal at Fredericton, the twenty eighth day of December, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty nine, and in the thirty third year of Her Majesty's Reign.

UNITED STATES—MAINE.

BEACONS ON THE EAST END OF MOOSE A BEC REACH.

The United States Government has given notice, That the following Beacons have been erected at the east entrance of Moose a Bec Reach, Maine:—

Gilchrist's Rock.—An iron shaft 35 feet high with a circular cage on the top.

Moose Rock.—An iron tripod 30 feet high with a rectangular cage on the top 6 feet high by 4 feet broad.

Snow's Rock.—A modern shaft 25 feet high with a cask on top.
