A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS an Act intituled "An Act relating to Marriage Licenses," passed by the Legislative Council and Assembly of this Province, at the Session of 1869, was reserved by me on the twenty first day of April, in the year aforesaid, for the signification of the Governor General's pleasure thereon;

I do therefore hereby publish and proclaim that the said Act did receive the assent of His Excellency the Governor General in Council, on the twelfth day of April instant.

Given under my Hand and Seal at Fredericton, the twentieth day of April, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy, and in the thirty third year of Her Majesty's Reign.

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor General in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the thirty first year of Her Majesty's Reign, intituled "An Act for the Union of Canada, Nova Scotia, and New Brunswick, and the Government thereof, and for purposes connected therewith," it is amongst other things enacted, that a Bill reserved for the signification of the pleasure of the Governor General, shall not have any force unless and until within one year from the day on which it was presented to the Lieutenant Governor for the Governor General's assent, the Lieutenant Governor signifies by Speech or Message, to each of the Houses of the Legislature, or by Proclamation, that it has received the assent of the Governor General in Council; and whereas on the 21st day of April, 1869, the Lieutenant Governor of the Province of New Brunswick reserved a certain Bill passed by the Legislative Council and Assembly of the said Province, intituled "A Bill relating to Marriage Licenses," for the signification of the Governor General's pleasure thereon; and whereas the said Bill so reserved as aforesaid, has been laid before the Governor General in Council, and it is expedient that the said Bill should be assented to by the Governor General: Now, therefore, the Governor General, in pursuance of the said Act, and in the exercise of the powers thereby reserved to the Governor General as aforesaid, doth, by this present Order, by and with the advice of his Privy Council, declare his assent to the said Bill, and the Secretary of State for the Provinces is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

CAP. XCIII.

An Act relating to Marriage Licenses.

21st April 1869.

Be it enacted by the Lieutenant Governor, Legislative Council, and Assembly, as follows:—

1. That all Marriage Licences issued and signed by any Lieutenant Governor or Administrator of the Government of this Province, since the first day of May one thousand eight hundred and fifty four, by virtue of his Office, and all Marriage Licences signed by any Deputy Governor since the first day of July one thousand eight hundred and sixty seven, shall be deemed as valid and effectual as though he had been specially authorized by Act of the Legislature of this Province to sign the same.

2. That from and after the passing of this Act, all Marriage Licences shall be issued from the Office of the Provincial Secretary, under the hand and seal of the Lieutenant Governor, or of the person administering the Government of this Province for the time being.
