twenty eighth day of December in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty nine, is declared to be legal and valid to all intents and purposes; and the officers then elected to serve in the said Parish for the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy, are hereby declared duly elected and confirmed in their respective offices for one year, or until others are elected in their stead in the ordinary manner.

2. The Clerk of the Peace of the said County shall within fourteen days after the passing of this Act, furnish the Town Clerk of the said Parish with a true copy of the certified list, signed by the Chairman and Town Clerk, as laid before the Sessions in January last, who shall within six days thereafter post up lists of the officers so appointed in three or more public places in the said Parish ; and every officer so elected or appointed and notified, shall within six days thereafter make oath before a Justice of the Peace to fulfil the duties of his office, and such Justice shall give notice thereof to the Clerk of the Peace.

CAP. XV.

An Act to change the name of The Lewy's Island Railroad Company Passed 28th March 1870.

WHEREAS it is desirable to alter the name of The Lewy's Island Railroad Company ;-

Be it therefore enacted by the Lieutenant Governor, Legislative Council, and Assembly,-

That from and after the passing of this Act, the Company or Body Corporate now called and named "The Lewy's Island Railroad Company," shall be called and known by the name of "The Saint Croix and Penobscot Railroad Company," any law to the contrary notwithstanding.

A sum not exceeding one hundred and sixty dollars to pay Fishery Bounty, West Isles, for the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy.

A sum not exceeding nine hundred dollars for the registry of Marriage Certificates during the current year.

A sum not exceeding one thousand two hundred dollars in aid of the Saint John Public Hospital.

A sum not exceeding four thousand dollars to meet unforeseen expenses during the current year.

A sum not exceeding one thousand dollars to reimburse Otis Small, and Charles Harrison Hatheway, in full for the services of the Steamer "Emperor," during the year 1868, on the North Shore.

2. The several sums of money aforementioned shall be paid by warrant or cheque out of public moneys now or hereafter in the Receiver General's hands.
