GULF OF ST LAWRENCE—NORTHUMBERLAND STRAIT.

Fixed Light on Jourimain Island.

The Canadian Government has given Notice, that from the 15th day of May 1870, a Light will be exhibited from a Lighthouse recently erected on Jourimain Island, Northumberland Strait.

The light will be a fixed white light, elevated 72 feet above high water, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 14 miles.

The Lighthouse is 40 feet high, octagonal shaped, and painted white; it stands 66 feet from the extremity of the cliff, and its position, as given, is in lat. 46° 10' N., long. 63° 50' W.

The Keeper's dwelling (painted white) is 50 feet westward of the Lighthouse.

WEST INDIES—NEW GRENADA.

Fixed Light at Santa Marta.

Information has been received through the French Government, that a Light is now exhibited from a Lighthouse on Morro Island, Santa Marta.

The light is a fixed white light, elevated 328 feet above the sea, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 24 miles.
