A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS Her most Gracious Majesty, by Her Royal Warrant under Her Sign Manual dated the seventh day of May now last past, and transmitted by the Right Honorable the Secretary of State for the Colonies, did authorize and direct that a certain Seal prepared by the order of Her Majesty, and which accompanied the said Warrant, should be used for the sealing of all things whatsoever which pass the Great Seal of this Province, and for Her Majesty's Service in this Province;

I do therefore hereby proclaim and declare that the said Seal shall be henceforth used in this Province for the sealing of all things whatsoever, which shall pass the Great Seal of this Province, on, from and after the first day of January next.

Given under my Hand and Seal at Fredericton, the twenty eighth day of December, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty nine, and in the thirty third year of Her Majesty's Reign.

UNITED STATES—NEW YORK.

FIXED LIGHT ON NORTH BROTHER ISLAND.

The United States Government has given notice, That from the 10th day of November 1869, a light will be exhibited from the southern end of North Brother Island, in the East River, between Long Island Sound and New York Harbour.

The light is a fixed white light, elevated 50 feet above the level of the sea.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric or by lenses, of the sixth order.

The tower is built of wood, painted a light drab colour, and is attached to the keeper's dwelling.

LAKE ONTARIO.

ALTERATION OF LIGHT, OSWEGO HARBOUR.

Also, That from the 5th day of November 1869, the following alteration would be made in the light at the entrance of Oswego Harbour, Lake Ontario, viz:—

The fixed light would be replaced by a revolving light attaining its greatest brilliancy every minute and a half.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric or by lenses, of the third order.
