A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS in and by the eleventh Section of an Act of the General Assembly of this Province, made and passed in the thirty third year of Her Majesty's Reign, Chapter Fifty, intituled "An Act to remove the Shire Town of King's County to a more convenient locality," it was enacted, that as soon as the new Public Buildings, the erection of which was contemplated by the said Act, were in all respects fit and suitable for the public service, the General or Special Sessions for the said County of King's should certify the same to the Lieutenant Governor in Council, whereupon Proclamation of the same should be made in the Royal Gazette;

And whereas a Special Sessions of the said County was held on the eighteenth day of January instant, who in terms of the said Section have certified to the Lieutenant Governor in Council, that the new Buildings erected under the said Act are in all respects fit and suitable for the public service:

Now I do therefore hereby, in pursuance of the provisions of the said Section of the said Act, proclaim the said New Buildings to be in all respects fit and suitable for the public service, of which all persons will take notice and govern themselves accordingly.
