THE Board of Education has been pleased to direct the publication of the following Orders made at its Meetings of November 26th, 1872, and December 21st, 1872.

By order. THEODORE H. RAND,
Chief Superintendent of Education.

Ordered, That whenever a formal and well grounded complaint from a number of Rate-payers in any School District is laid before the Board as to the incompetency of the Teacher engaged in the District, and the Trustees persist in retaining the services of such Teacher, the Board may, at its discretion, order the re-examination of such Teacher at the next regular examination of Candidates for Teacher's Certificates.—November 26th. 1872.

Ordered, That the License granted by the Board of Education to Lazarus Theriau, August 5th, 1869, for the Northern District of the Province, be hereby revoked.—December 21st, 1872.

Ordered, That nothing in REGULATION 20 shall be taken to prevent the wearing of the cross or other emblem as ordinarily worn by the members at large of any Denomination of Christians.—December 21st, 1872.
