LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL CHAMBER,

FREDERICTON, 11th April, 1872.

At three o'clock this day, His Excellency the Honorable Lemuel Allan Wilmot, D. C. L., Lieutenant Governor of the Province of New Brunswick, came to the Council Chamber, and being seated on the Throne, commanded the attendance of the House of Assembly; who being come, His Excellency was pleased to close the Session with the following
