### BAY OF FUNDY—L'ETANG HARBOUR.

#### Fixed Red Light on Bliss Island.

The Government of the Dominion of Canada has given notice that a Light is now exhibited from the west point of Bliss Island, entrance of L'Etang Harbour, Bay of Fundy.

The light is a fixed red light, elevated 45 feet above the sea, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 12 miles. The illuminating apparatus is catoptric or by reflectors.

The Lighthouse, 30 feet high, is square, and painted white.—Position, lat. 45° 1' 15" N., long. 66° 51' W.

All Magistrates and others are therefore notified that, except in the case of lunatics clearly dangerous and violent, it would be advisable, before issuing or procuring Warrants of apprehension and commitment, to communicate with Dr. Waddell.

## INDIAN AFFAIRS.

THE attention of the Public is called to Section 12, of Chapter 42, of the Statutes of Canada, 1868, which is as follows:

"12. No person shall sell, barter, exchange or give to any Indian man, woman, or child, in Canada, any kind of spirituous liquors, in any manner or way, or cause or procure the same to be done, for any purpose whatsoever;—and if any person so sells, barter, exchanges or gives any such spirituous liquors to any Indian man, woman or child as aforesaid, or causes the same to be done, he shall on conviction thereof, before any Justice of the Peace, upon the evidence of one credible witness other than the informer or prosecutor, be fined not exceeding twenty dollars for each such offence, one moiety to go to the informer or prosecutor, and the other moiety to Her Majesty to form part of the fund for the benefit of that tribe, band or body of Indians with respect to one or more members of which the offence was committed; but no such penalty shall be incurred by furnishing to any Indian in case of sickness, any spirituous liquor, either by a medical man or under the direction of a medical man or clergyman."

And whereas the said Law has been violated in many instances, I do hereby respectfully request all Magistrates and persons in authority, and any other person interested in the welfare of the Indian, and the community at large within my superintendency, to aid and assist in carrying the said Law into effect.
