### ST. LAWRENCE RIVER.

#### Light-Vessel on St. Roque Shoal.

With reference to Notice to Mariners No. 97, dated 9th December 1871, on the placing of a light-vessel on the north-western edge of St. Roque shoal in the St. Lawrence river, below Quebec;

Further information has been received, that the light-vessel is moored in 3½ fathoms at low water springs, and occupies the position of the black buoy at the south entrance of the narrows between the Middle Ground and the Shoals of St. Roque, in lat. 47° 20' N., and nearly 4 miles N. W. by W. from the church of St. Roque.

#### Fog Signal at Digby Lighthouse.

Also, that a steam fog whistle has been established at Digby lighthouse in the Bay of Fundy.

In thick or foggy weather, or during snow storms, the whistle will be sounded eight seconds in each minute, thus making an interval of fifty two seconds between each blast.

The whistle has been heard—

In calm weather—15 miles.

With the wind—20 miles.

In stormy weather and against the wind—6 miles.

### BAY OF FUNDY—NEW BRUNSWICK.

#### Revolving Light on South Wolf Island.

The Government of the Dominion of Canada has given notice, that a light is now exhibited from a lighthouse recently erected on the South Wolf Island, Bay of Fundy.

The light is a revolving white light attaining its greatest brilliancy every one and a half minutes, elevated 111 feet above the level of high water, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 18 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is catoptric, or by reflectors.

The lantern surmounts the keeper's dwelling, is 35 feet high, and with the dwelling, painted white. It is situated on the southeast point of the island.
