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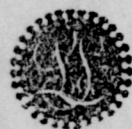

NEW BRUNSWICK—BAY OF FUNDY.

Revolving Light on Cape Spencer.

The Government of the Dominion of Canada has given notice, that a Light is now exhibited from a Lighthouse on Cape Spencer, Bay of Fundy.

The light is a revolving red and white light, visible seaward from E.S.E. to W.N.W., showing red for forty five seconds, and white for forty five seconds, with an interval of forty five seconds between each appearance of the light, making a complete revolution in three minutes. It is elevated 207 feet above the level of high water, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 20 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is catoptric, or by reflectors.

The Lighthouse, 35 feet high, is a square white building with a tower erected on it.

[All bearings are Magnetic. Variation 19° westerly in 1873.]
