circuses, or other shows or exhibitions for hire or profit, and for preserving quiet and good order thereat :

Twenty first—To establish and regulate one or more pounds, and the fees to be taken thereat :

Twenty second—To restrain, regulate or prevent the running at large of horses, cattle, swine, goats, sheep, dogs, geese, poultry, and to impound the same :

Twenty third—To impose a tax on the owners or harbourers of dogs, and to regulate and prevent dogs running at large, and to provide for killing such as are found so running at large, contrary to any law or bye law, after public notice is given :

Twenty fourth—To abate and cause to be removed all public nuisances, and all filth and encumbrances on the streets :

Twenty fifth—To regulate the construction of privy vaults and sinks on private property:

Twenty sixth—To cause vacant lots in central situations, when they become nuisances, to be properly enclosed at the cost and expense of the owners, and to recover such expenses with costs in a summary manner:

Twenty seventh—To regulate and prevent the erection or continuance of slaughter houses, distilleries, and tanneries, and manufactories or trades which may be likely to become nuisances :

Twenty eighth—To prevent the ringing of bells, blowing of horns, shouting, and other unusual noises on the streets and other public places :

Twenty ninth—To purchase, enclose, plant, lay out and adorn any public square, park, or parade, for the use of the Town, and to make and ordain rules for the government and preservation thereof, and to impose penalties and punishments by fine or imprisonment, or both, for the violation or non-observance of such rules:

Thirtieth—To prevent the injuring or destroying of trees planted within any of the streets or public grounds of the said Town:

Thirty first—To prevent immoderate driving or riding within the Town:

Thirty second—To establish bathing houses, and to prevent or regulate bathing within or near said Town :

Thirty third—To regulate and license owners of livery stables, or other owners of horses or carriages letting out the same for hire or profit, and also porters, butchers, and hucksters :

Thirty fourth—To appoint and regulate a Police Force for the said Town, and to license auctioneers and regulate their fees, and the manner of conducting auctions :

Thirty fifth—To provide for the proper keeping of the poor, and management of any house of refuge, hospital, workhouse, bridewell, or house of correction, that may be established in the said Town, and also to provide for the erection or establishment of any such houses of refuge, hos-

Thirty ninth—To prevent or regulate the firing or setting off of squibs, fire balls, crackers, or other fireworks:

Fortieth—To prevent or regulate the keeping and transporting of gunpowder or other combustible or dangerous substances:

Forty first—To prevent or regulate the use of fire lights or candles in livery or other stables, and in cabinet makers' and carpenters' shops, and in other places where combustible substances are kept, and to prevent or punish the use of pipes and cigars in such places:

Forty second—To regulate the carrying on of manufactories or trades dangerous in causing or promotion of fires :

Forty third—To regulate and require the safe keeping of ashes in proper deposits :

Forty fourth—To provide for the security, safety and advantage of the inhabitants, by such rules and regulations and restrictions as they may deem expedient to be observed by all persons in the erection of buildings to be built within the populous parts of the said Town :

Forty fifth—To regulate the construction of any chimney, flue, fire place, stove, oven, boiler, or other apparatus or things in any house, manufactory or business which may be dangerous in causing or promoting fires :

Forty sixth—To enforce the proper cleaning of chimneys: Forty seventh—To regulate the number of fire buckets to be provided by the several inhabitants, and the time and manner in which they shall be so provided, and also to provide for the management and examination of such buckets and the use of them at fires:

Forty eighth—To regulate the conduct and enforce the assistance of the inhabitants at fires, and for the preservation of property thereat:

Forty ninth—To make regulations for the suppressing of fires and the pulling down or demolishing adjunct houses, and remunerating the owners thereof in certain circumstances:

*Fiftieth*—To compel the owners or occupiers of houses to have ladders leading to and on the roof of such houses:

Fifty first—To establish and regulate engine, fire, hook, ladder, and property saving companies, and to provide and afford exemptions and immunities to the officers and members thereof:

Fifty second—To provide for the purchase of such and so many fire engines as they may deem necessary :

Fifty third—To provide for the payment of such premiums or rewards for early attendance of wagons and other vehicles with water at fires as to the said Town Council may from time to time seem expedient:

Fifty fourth—To appoint from time to time such and so many persons to be firewards as the said Council may think proper, and to enact rules and regulations prescribing the duties of such firewards:

pitals, workhouses, bridewells, or houses of correction, as they may deem necessary for the public welfare :

Thirty sixth—To erect, preserve and regulate public cisterns, reservoirs and other conveniences for the supply of good and wholesome water, or for the extinguishing of fires, and to make reasonable charges for the use thereof:

Thirty seventh—To establish, make and regulate public securifountains, pumps and wells, and to prevent the waste and the T fouling of public water: 43.

Thirty eighth—To prevent or regulate the firing of guns or other fire arms:

Fifty fifth—To regulate the management and provide for the security of the public property of any kind belonging to the said Town, and to provide for the permanent improvement of the said Town in all matters as well ornamental as useful:

*Fifty sixth*—To provide for the erection, preservation and security of lamp posts, sign boards, and other fixtures within the Town.

43. The said Council shall have and they are hereby inr vested with the sole and exclusive power to open, lay out, regulate, repair, amend, and clear the streets, lanes and alleys
