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In thick and foggy weather and snow storms, the whistle will be sounded five seconds every minute. The whistle will probably be heard from a distance of 10 to 15 miles in calm weather, and 3 to 6 miles in stormy weather, or against the

(4) Fixed Light on Michipicoten Island.

Also, that a light is now exhibited from a lighthouse recently erected on the south side of Michipicoten Island, at the east side of Quebec harbour entrance.

The light is a fixed white light, elevated about 60 feet above the level of the lake, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 15 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is catoptric, or by reflectors. The tower is built of wood, 32 feet high, and painted white. Position, lat. 47° 42′ 15″ N., long. 86° 1′ 30″ W.

(5) Quebec Harbour Light.

Also, that a fixed white harbour light is exhibited from a wooden tower on Agate Island in Quebec harbour; it is 32 feet above the level of the sea, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 10 miles.

Note .- The light is for guiding vessels into the harbour. The channel is marked by four buoys, viz: two on the east side, painted red, and two on the west side, painted black.

(6) Alteration in colour of lights of Sandy Hook Light-vessel.
