### GOVERNMENT NOTICE

Under Act 25th Victoria, Chapter 28.

This is to certify, That Jacob S. Browne, Abram Volk, Charles C. Ward, John M. Moffitt, and George G. M'Glashan, all of the City of New York, have this day filed in the Office of the Provincial Secretary of New Brunswick, a Memorandum of Association for the incorporation of a Company to be styled "The Bay of Fundy Red Granite Company," for the purpose of quarrying, working, polishing, shipping and selling Stone, Metals, and Minerals, at Saint George, with such other things as are incident to the attainment of those objects, with a Capital of Two hundred thousand Dollars, to be divided into two thousand shares of one hundred dollars each, and that the Office or principal place of business to be at Saint George, County of Charlotte, in the Province of New Brunswick.

### EDUCATION OFFICE,

Fredericton, N. B., Jan. 25, 1873.

THE BOARD OF EDUCATION has been pleased to direct the publication of the following Orders made January 24th, 1873:—

Ordered, by virtue of the authority vested in the Board of Education by Section 6, sub-section (8), of The Common Schools Act 1871—

1. That in Districts where Trustee-Corporations exist, and there has been a failure at the annual election to act in conformity with any of the provisions of Sec. 32, the Inspector shall require the Trustees to determine by lot which member of the Corporation is to vacate the office of Trustee; and in case the Trustees, on the requirement of the Inspector, fail so to determine, it shall be the duty of the Inspector to determine the same by lot: and thereupon the Inspector shall, on the requisition of seven rate-payers of the District, proceed to fill the vacancy.

2. That whenever a new District is created, or whenever in any District the annual meeting has not been held, either by reason of the want of Trustees or of neglect, or by reason of a failure to organize such meeting, or for other cause, or whenever the proceedings of an annual meeting have been set aside on appeal to the Inspector or the Chief Superintendent, the Inspector shall have power to call an annual meeting at such time and at such place in the District as he shall determine, by notice posted at least six days previously in two of the most public places in the District; and such meeting so called shall be an Annual Meeting, and have and exercise all the powers of an Annual Meeting.
