CAP. XVI.

An Act to repeal Chapter 15, of Title iii, of the Revised Statutes, 'Of the Export Duty on Lumber,' and the several Acts in continuation and amendment of and in addition to the said Chapter.

Passed 14th April, 1873.

BE it enacted by the Lieutenant Governor, Legislative Council, and Assembly, as follows:—

1. Chapter 15, Title iii, of the Revised Statutes, 'Of the Export Duty on Lumber,' as well as the several Acts of Assembly in continuation and amendment of and in addition to the said Chapter, shall be and are hereby declared to be repealed from and after the time of the coming into force of this Act.

2. The Governor in Council shall, by Proclamation to be published in the Royal Gazette of this Province, declare the time when this Act shall come into operation and be in force.

3. Notwithstanding the repeal of the said Chapter and the said several Acts, the same shall remain in force so far but only so far as to enable the Province to recover all sum or sums payable thereunder for the use of the Province up to the time when this Act shall come into force by virtue of the said Proclamation.

CAP. XVII.

An Act in amendment of and in addition to the Laws relating to Highways.

Passed 14th April, 1873.

BE it enacted by the Lieutenant Governor, Legislative Council, and Assembly, as follows:—

1. Notwithstanding anything contained in any law to the contrary, no person of the age of sixty years and upwards shall be assessed or liable to perform Statute labour on Roads except only for any real or personal estate he may possess; and no such person shall be assessed or liable to perform Statute labour for or by reason of his poll.

2. Any such person seeking to be exempted from assessment or liability to perform Statute labour, for or by reason of his poll, under the provisions of this Act, shall make oath before some Justice of the Peace residing in the Parish where such person seeking such exemption resides, stating that to the best of his knowledge he has attained the age of sixty years, and such Justice shall thereupon give to such person seeking exemption as aforesaid a certificate that such oath has been duly made, and such certificate shall be proof that the person therein named is exempt from assessment or liability to perform Statute labour for or by reason of his poll; and no person shall be liable to any penalty for the non-performance of any Statute labour, or the non-payment

of any assessment for which he may be exempted by virtue of this Act.

3. Nothing in this Act shall apply to or in any way interfere with assessments on property, real or personal, for the clearing, maintaining and repairing Roads, either by Statute labour, money, or otherwise.

4. That this Act shall be read in connection with and as part of the Act of Assembly twenty fifth Victoria, Chapter sixteen, intituled *An Act in amendment and consolidation of the Laws relating to Highways*, and shall not extend to any Cities or Towns to which such Act does not extend.

CAP. XVIII.

An Act to repeal an Act intituled An Act to amend Chapter 52, Title viii, of Revised Statutes, 'Of Counties, Towns, and Parishes.'

Passed 14th April, 1873.

BE it enacted by the Lieutenant Governor, Legislative Council, and Assembly, as follows:—

1. That an Act made and passed in the thirty fifth year of the Reign of Her present Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled *An Act to amend Chapter 52, Title viii, of Revised Statutes, 'Of Counties, Towns, and Parishes,'* be and the same is hereby repealed.

2. That all elections and other proceedings of Parish Officers which have taken place under the provisions of the said Act, shall be valid.

3. That nothing in this Act contained shall be held to repeal or limit the operation of the second section of an Act passed in the thirty fifth year of the Reign of Her present Majesty, intituled *An Act to alter the time for holding the March Term of the Court of General Sessions of the Peace for the County of King's County*, but the time for the election of Parish Officers in King's County, shall be as provided in the Act in this section mentioned.

CAP. XIX.

An Act to authorize the sale of certain Lands held for the purposes of Chapter 90 of the Revised Statutes.

WHEREAS certain lands in the Parish of Lancaster, in the City and County of Saint John, are vested in Her Majesty the Queen for the purposes connected with the Provincial Lunatic Asylum; and whereas a portion of such lands lying to the northward of the road leading from the Suspension Bridge to the old Manawagonish Road, which has heretofore been used as a farm in connection with such Asylum, has, by reason of the same being traversed by the lines of the European and North American Railway Company for extension from Saint John westward, and of the Carleton Branch Railway Company, become unsuitable for such purposes; and it is desirable that the same should be sold, and the proceeds invested in the purchase of another piece of land more suitable for the purposes aforesaid;—

Be it therefore enacted by the Lieutenant Governor, Legislative Council, and Assembly, as follows:—

1. The Governor in Council may sell the said lands lying to the northward of the said road from the Suspension bridge to the old Manawagonish road, either in one lot or in several
