WHEREAS the General Assembly of this Province stands prorogued to Thursday the twenty seventh day of November instant, I have thought fit further to prorogue the said General Assembly, and the same is hereby prorogued accordingly to Thursday the eighth day of January next.

Given under my Hand and Seal at Fredericton, this seventeenth day of November, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy three, and in the thirty seventh year of Her Majesty's Reign.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by an Act made and passed in the thirty fourth year of the Reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act to facilitate the construction of the Albert Railway," it was amongst other things enacted that the said Act should not be in force until it should be determined by a majority of the Ratepayers in the said Parishes of Hillsborough, Hopewell, and Harvey, that they desire that said Act should be in force in the manner by the said Act provided; and it was thereby further enacted that if it should appear to the Sheriff of the County of Albert, in the manner therein provided, that a majority of all the votes given at a meeting to be held as provided by the said Act, was in the affirmative, and that the persons voting "Yea" represented more than one half of the valuation of all the property of the Ratepayers present and voting at such meeting, he should duly announce the same, and transmit a certificate thereof to the Lieutenant Governor, and the Lieutenant Governor should thereupon publish in the *Royal Gazette* a notice that the said Act should be and from thenceforth should be in full force and effect;

And whereas the Sheriff of Albert County has certified to the Lieutenant Governor that a majority of all the votes given at the meeting held as provided by the said Act, was in the affirmative, and that the persons voting "Yea" represent more than one half of the valuation of all the property of the Ratepayers present and voting at such meeting, and it appears that the said Sheriff duly announced the same;

NOW THEREFORE I do hereby in and by virtue of the said Act of Assembly proclaim and declare, and hereby give notice, that the said Act of Assembly, 34th Victoria, Chapter 53, is, and from henceforth shall be, in full force and effect.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by an Act made and passed in the thirty sixth year of the Reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act to aid in the construction of certain Railways in this Province," it was amongst other things enacted that the said Act should not be in force until it should be accepted and approved by the Ratepayers on real or personal estate within the Parishes of Coverdale, Hillsborough, Hopewell, Harvey, and Alma, at public meetings held in the manner by the said Act provided; and it was thereby further enacted, that if it should appear to the Sheriff of the County of Albert, from the books and certificates returned as by the said Act provided, that a majority of all the votes given at the said meetings was in the affirmative, and that the persons voting "Yea" represent more than one half the valuation of all the property of the Ratepayers, as represented by the Assessment List, present and voting at such meeting, he should transmit a certificate thereof to the Lieutenant Governor, and the Lieutenant Governor should thereupon publish in the *Royal Gazette* a notice that the said Act should be and from thenceforth should be in full force and effect;

And whereas the Sheriff of the said County of Albert has certified to the Lieutenant Governor, that upon all the books and certificates returned to him, as provided by the said Act, he finds that a majority of all the votes so given, as by the said Act provided, was in the affirmative, and that the persons voting "Yea" represent more than one half the valuation of all the property of the Ratepayers, as represented by the Assessment List, present and voting at the meeting by the said Act provided;

NOW THEREFORE I do hereby in and by virtue of the said Act of Assembly proclaim and declare, and hereby give notice, that the said Act of Assembly, 36th Victoria, Chapter 40, is, and from henceforth shall be, in full force and effect.
