A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by a certain Act made and passed at the last Session of the Legislature of this Province, intituled "An Act to remove the Shire Town of Victoria

County to the Parish of Andover or Perth," authority was given to the Lieutenant Governor of this Province to select a convenient site in the Parish of Andover or Perth, in the County of Victoria, at or near which the Public Buildings for the said County thereafter mentioned should be erected, and to declare by Proclamation the place so selected;

And whereas I have determined upon a convenient site in the Parish of Andover, in the said County of Victoria, for the purpose aforesaid;—

Now, therefore, I do hereby proclaim and declare, that under and by virtue of the authority aforesaid, I have selected the following site in the Parish of Andover, in the said County of Victoria, at or near which the Public Buildings for the said County shall be erected, that is to say—That tract or plot of Land which lies between Beveridge's Store and Gallagher Hill, so called.

INSTRUCTIONS TO BYE ROAD COMMISSIONERS.

ALL Accounts and Vouchers for the current year must be "transmitted to the Provincial Secretary's Office" on or before the first day of December next, sworn to before a Justice of the Peace.

Accounts must be made on the printed Sheets furnished to the Commissioners, or on Sheets in the same form.

When more than one Commissioner is appointed to expend money, a memorandum signed by the Commissioners, shewing how the amount is divided, and the sum each is to expend, must be sent in to the Provincial Secretary's Office, with the Commissioner's Bond, after the receipt of which the Warrant for payment of the money will issue.

Each Voucher or Receipt for money paid by the Commissioners must be numbered, and be for the amount paid, written in words at length, and state the nature of the work or service performed; the amount may be placed in figures on the margin of the Receipt. Vouchers should be written only on one side of the paper, and those signed by Marksmen must be witnessed.
