A PROCLAMATION.

THEREAS by Royal Proclamation dated at Windsor Castle on the twenty second day of May one thousand 100 acres, in rear of lot 4, N. of Burnt Church River, Francis eight hundred and sixty seven, Her Most Gracious Majesty did ordain, declare and command that on and after the first day of July one thousand eight hundred and sixty seven, the Provinces of Canada, Nova Scotia and New Brunswick should form and become a Dominion, under the name of

And whereas the anniversary of the formation of the Dominion of Canada falls upon Wednesday the first day of July next ensuing; and whereas it is meet and proper that the said anniversary should be observed and kept;-

Now Know YE, that I do hereby proclaim and appoint WEDNESDAY the first day of July next as a general Holiday; and I do hereby enjoin and call upon all Her Majesty's loving subjects throughout the Province to join in the due and proper celebration and observance of the said Anniversary.

INSTRUCTIONS TO BYE ROAD COMMISSIONERS.

ALL Accounts and Vouchers for the current year must be "transmitted to the Provincial Secretary's Office" on or before the first day of December next, sworn to before a Justice of the Peace.

Accounts must be made on the printed Sheets furnished to the Commissioners, or on Sheets in the same form.

When more than one Commissioner is appointed to expend money, a memorandum signed by the Commissioners, shewing how the amount is divided, and the sum each is to expend, must be sent in to the Provincial Secretary's Office, with the Commissioner's Bond, after the receipt of which

Each Voucher or Receipt for money paid by the Commissioners must be numbered, and be for the amount paid, written in words at length, and state the nature of the work or service performed; the amount may be placed in figures on the margin of the Receipt. Vouchers should be written only on one side of the paper, and those signed by Marksmen must be witnessed.
