A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS an Act intituled "An Act to further continue and amend the Act to incorporate the Meduxnikik Boom Company," passed by the Legislative Council and Assembly of this Province at the Session of 1874, was reserved by me on the eighth day of April in the year aforesaid, for the signification of the Governor General's pleasure thereon;—

I do therefore hereby publish and proclaim that the said Act did receive the assent of His Excellency the Governor General in Council on the twenty ninth day of May last.

His Excellency the Governor General in Council.

WHEREAS by "The British North America Act 1867," it is, amongst other things, in effect enacted, that a Bill reserved for the signification of the pleasure of the Gover-

nor General, shall not have any force unless and until within one year from the day on which it was presented to the Lieutenant Governor for the Governor General's assent, the Lieutenant Governor signifies by Speech or Message to each of the Houses of the Legislature, or by Proclamation, that it has received the assent of the Governor General in Council;

And whereas on the eighth day of April 1874, the Lieutenant Governor of the Province of New Brunswick reserved a certain Bill passed by the Legislative Council and Assembly of the said Province, intituled "A Bill to further continue and amend the Act to incorporate the Meduxnikik Boom Company," for the signification of the Governor General's pleasure thereon;

And whereas the said Bill, so reserved as aforesaid, has been laid before the Governor General in Council, and it is expedient that the said Bill should be assented to by the Governor General in Council:

Now, therefore, the Governor General, in pursuance of the said Act, and in the exercise of the powers thereby reserved to the Governor General as aforesaid, doth by this present Order, by and with the advice of the Queen's Privy Council for Canada, assent to the said Bill;

And the Secretary of State of Canada is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
