## BY AUTHORITY. ADDITIONAL GENERAL RULE OF THE ELECTION COURT FOR THE PROVINCE OF NEW BRUNSWICK.

When a Petition shall be at issue, pursuant to Sec. 15 of the 36th Vic. Cap. 28, the application by either party to fix some convenient day for hearing of the cause, and the production of evidence, shall be made by leaving with the Clerk of the Election Court, at his Office, a written application, signed by the applicant himself, or by his Attorney, in the form or to the effect following:—

Which application shall be entered by the Clerk in his Book of Records, and a copy thereof shall be by him forthwith transmitted to the Chief Justice, or in his absence, the Senior Judge of the said Court, who, with the Judges to preside in said Court, shall name a day and place when and where the said Court will meet, notice of which shall be given by the Clerk so soon as he shall receive from the Judges of the Court an intimation thereof, by posting a notice in his Office, and by mailing a like notice to the address of the parties or their Attorneys respectively, in sufficient time that, if delivered by due course of mail, the parties may have not less than five days' notice at which time and place the Court shall meet, and hear the parties, if they desire to be heard, in reference to such application, and shall consider the same and deal therewith as said Court shall deem just and right.
