A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by Royal Proclamation dated at Windsor Castle on the twenty second day of May one thousand eight hundred and sixty seven, Her Most Gracious Majesty did ordain, declare and command that on and after the first day of July one thousand eight hundred and sixty seven, the Provinces of Canada, Nova Scotia and New Brunswick should form and become a Dominion, under the name of CANADA:

And whereas the anniversary of the formation of the Dominion of Canada falls upon Thursday the first day of July next ensuing; and whereas it is meet and proper that the said anniversary should be observed and kept;—

NOW KNOW YE, that I do hereby proclaim and appoint THURSDAY the first day of July next, as a general Holiday; and I do hereby enjoin and call upon all Her Majesty's loving subjects throughout the Province to join in the due and proper celebration and observance of the said Anniversary.

Given under my Hand and Seal at Fredericton, the fifteenth day of June, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy five, and in the thirty eighth year of Her Majesty's Reign.
