A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by Royal Proclamation dated at Windsor Castle on the twenty second day of May one thousand eight hundred and sixty seven, Her Most Gracious Majesty did ordain, declare and command that on and after the first day of July one thousand eight hundred and sixty seven, the Provinces of Canada, Nova Scotia and New Brunswick should form and become a Dominion, under the name of

And whereas the anniversary of the formation of the Dominion of Canada falls upon Thursday the first day of July next ensuing; and whereas it is meet and proper that the said anniversary should be observed and kept;—

Now Know YE, that I do hereby proclaim and appoint THURSDAY the first day of July next, as a general Holiday; and I do hereby enjoin and call upon all Her Majesty's loving subjects throughout the Province to join in the due and proper celebration and observance of the said Anniversary

Given under my Hand and Seal at Fredericton, the fifteenth day of June, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy five, and in the thirty eighth year of Her Majesty's Reign.

CROWN LAND OFFICE, June 19th, 1875.

A MINING LEASE for one or more square miles on Crown Land in the County of Saint John, agreeably to the following Regulations, will be offered for sale by Public Auction at this Office on Wednesday the 28th day of July next, at noon.

1. Every Mining License shall be exempted from Royalty on Coal and all other Minerals, except Gold and Silver, for ten

2. That the right of Mining for the term of twenty five years, within a tract not exceeding five square miles, as may be applied for within any County, shall be put up at a fixed rent of twenty cents per chaldron on Coal, and five per cent on the value of all other Minerals, including Gold and Silver, raised or dug, to be paid on the first day of January, April, July, and October, in each year, to the Receiver General, or an Agent to be appointed by the Lieutenant Governor in Council; provided that such Royalty shall not be exacted during the continuance of the Lease, if the Lessee or his Assigns shall make it appear on oath to the satisfaction of the Lieutenant Governor in Council, that the profits of the undertaking, over and above reasonable expenses, and the Royalty to the Crown, do not exceed six per cent on the capital invested; and provided also, that the Lessee or Assignee shall furnish to the Receiver General, or such Agent as aforesaid, quarterly, at the days above named,
